ICE stands for Immigration and Customs Enforcement.




ICE officers might come to some houses or neighborhoods. They might even stop cars and school buses.

This can happen during the day or night.



If ICE officers come to my house, my family has a plan. My grown-ups know what to do. I do not have to open the door or talk to the officers. I can stay calm and quiet.



It is okay to feel scared or confused.

If I feel worried, I can take deep breaths or sit with a trusted grown-up.

My job is to stay safe and listen to my grown-up. Sometimes they might tell me to go to another room or stay quiet.



ICE officers are supposed to follow rules too. They need special papers called warrants to come inside without permission.



After ICE leaves, things may feel calmer. I can ask questions and my grown-ups will try to explain.



I am loved and cared for. Even if something scary happens, there are people who can help us, like family, friends, teachers, or lawyers. I am not alone!
